When I was young and in the early 1950's I lived near Midway Airport Chicago. Airplanes flew over our house every couple of minutes. Today they fly over every minute or less. But I was always drawn to the sound and type of airplanes they were.

I knew them by their sound. I knew every airline that existed in the U.S. Each of them had their distinctive color schemes and logos. United, Pan Am, Delta, TWA, Northwest and Eastern Air Lines. Eastern had a logo that I was fascinated in. A globe with wings!

Because Harrison Crabill thought that I was a good artist and worked in a printing company, he thought I could create a logo for the flying club. It was easy. I adapted the basic design from the Eastern Airlines logo. Because the MFC is located in north central Indiana I placed a map of Indiana inside the globe and placed a star over the area of Mentone. The colors yellow and blue make for good reproduction and visibility.

I submitted the design to the members of the club and it was accepted first round. The wing is such that it can be placed on either side of the globe for positioning on either left or right side of the airplanes.




Stickers and patches were made and I know Harrison was very pleased and proud to wear the logo. The date was 1972 when the logo was adopted.
